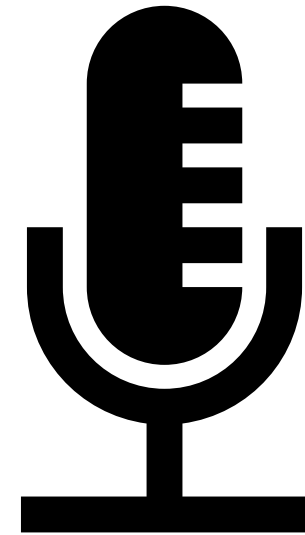

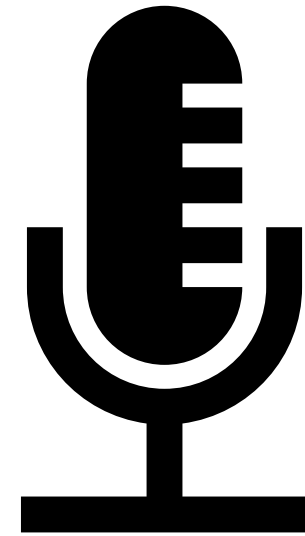

Panel: Recent EOs and Memos - Regulatory

- Unleashing American Energy
 - Orders review of all agency actions that pose “undue burden” to energy development and use
- Regulatory Freeze Pending Review
 - Freeze proposing or issuing new rules until new presidential department/agency head (or their nominee) reviews and approves

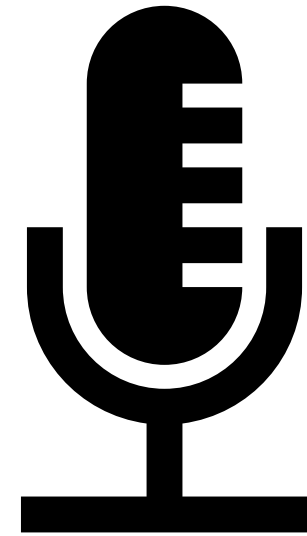
Are you stockpiling ahead of potential tariffs?

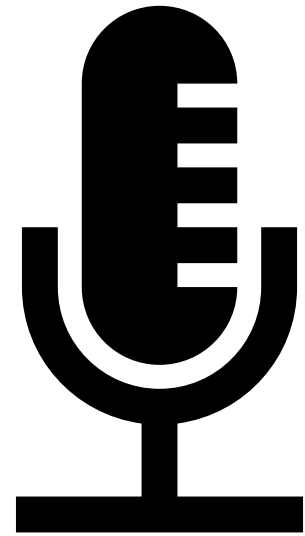
